The management of our lake environment is of critical concern to all residents. As the Board of Directors, it is our mission to explore current issues and trends in lake management and inform residents of possible courses of action. We have continued with the Harvesting Program, and many residents recently accessed the opportunity to have Hydro Raking done along their shorelines. On September 15th, we facilitated a presentation from Aquatic Control Technology, Inc., who detailed options in chemical treatment programs. Over 100 community members attended and engaged in meaningful discussion and inquiry about possible outcomes. Following the meeting, we formed a Lake Management Task Force with Board Member Lynn Wilbur serving as Chairperson. Approximately 20 people volunteered to join the Task Force, and the first meeting was scheduled for October 20th. The Task Force will investigate the latest technology and successful interventions

recommendations. We are extremely encouraged by the outpouring of interest, and hope to present additional informational programs over time.

The annual tradition of social events at Cossayuna include Friday Night Dinners, LaBoom, Open Mic Night, Jerry Simon Fishing Tournament, Ice Fishing Tournament, and Boat Parade, to name a few. We hope that even more residents and visitors will support our efforts to bring our lake community together. Consider volunteering for an event—you'll have a great time as you get to know people from around the lake.



We would like to thank all of this year's members for taking responsibility for our lake by joining the CLIA.


We concluded the membership drive with 237 members this year which represents 205 households.



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Lake Management Task Force Focuses on Milfoil Control

The Lake Management Task Force was set up at the Sept 15thmeeting. Lynn Wilbur is chairman of the Lake Management Committee on the CLIA board and of this task force. This task force is comprised of 22 people from around the lake interested in working toward significantly reducing and controlling invasive plants (esp. milfoil). The group will also explore ways to control zebra mussels and prevent introduction of

other invasive species. The ultimate goal is to improve lake conditions to enhance recreation and living quality on Cossayuna Lake. Our immediate concern is to get on track for a spring herbicide treatment in 2013. Different committees have been set up which are working on the present state and course of action as well as researching future options. We are being told by weed management experts that by treating larger

areas as one weedbed group we will have better results. If you own shoreline property and have milfoil, you might want to start talking to your neighbors about participating in this treatment program as well. The more participation we have, the better the coverage will be. More information on this subject along an application form to participate in the spring herbicide treatment will be in the January Newsletter.

Harvesting Report by Ron Remillard

In speaking for the Board and the entire Cossayuna Lake population, I would like to openly thank Dan and Marie Rokjer for their tireless efforts of devotion and dedication in managing the Harvesting Program on this lake for over 15 years. Our deepest thanks for a job well done! As I have suddenly realized, this program takes a lot of work!!!! Dan and Marie have transitioned myself and Frank Gabianelli to be the managers of the program.

The program employs two full-time operators who have

removed and dumped over 315 loads of weeds making four rounds of cuttings per property as well as open waters.

With all the investigation of the various methods of weed eradication, harvesting is still our best bet for weed removal and we will continue in this effort to the best of our ability. Hopefully, with the combination of a chemical program and harvesting, our lake will maintain its integrity and provide us with many years of enjoyment.

I would also like to extend

our gratitude to the towns of Argyle and Greenwich for their continued monetary support for the lake. Their contributions allow us to cut the open waters and more of the south end.

I thank you for your support to keep the pride in Cossayuna Lake an ongoing endeavor.


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
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This is a new address and, hopefully, will be much easier to remember. We've added a new item in our menu bar titled "Reports". We hope you find this information useful.



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
