## Spillway

We realize that there are many new homeowners in the community and we would like to explain the procedure and the reasoning for drawing down the lake in the fall. Our 2012 Lake Management Plan states that we are to begin winter draw down by removing the board from the spillway the day after Columbus Day and slowly drawing down the lake through October and completely opening the gates on the spillway by November 30<sup>th</sup> of each year. The reasons for drawing down the lake are two-fold. First, when the lake is drawn down any milfoil or curly-leaved pondweed that is exposed to the frost will be killed on the shorelines. Secondly, when the ice goes out in the spring

erosion of the shoreline is less likely if the lake is at the draw down level. We monitor the level of the lake throughout the year by opening or closing the spillway when necessary to maintain the proper water table so that septic systems around the lake can function more efficiently. Once the board is removed and the spillway is opened completely on Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> it remains that way for the entire winter until after the spring thaw. The CLIA only checks to make sure there are no blockages in the outlet or

spillway throughout the late fall and early winter months until the ice forms. We have no control over the ice pulling away from the shorelines throughout the winter months due to snow cover and melting conditions

## Algae Bloom by Marie Rokjer

Some of you are probably aware of the algae bloom that is present on the lake at this time. Here is an explanation taken from **THE COSSAYUNA STATE OF THE LAKE REPORT** that was prepared in conjunction with the New York State Federation of Lake Associations Watershed Management Planning Project. "As the summer progresses, there is an increase in algae growth, as measured by

*chlorophyll a, and an increase in phosphorus, with slightly decreased clarity. This increase in productivity is likely due to the mixing of nutrient-rich bottom waters with the lake surface waters when the lake de-stratifies in the fall. This enrichment of lake bottom waters, in turn, is likely due to the release of phosphorus from bottom sediments when oxygen levels fall to near zero in the lake bottom.*" Cossayuna Lake is an eutrophic lake and

normally experiences an algae bloom at this time every year. However, the bloom that is present now encompasses the entire lake. There are two sources of nutrient loading; internal and external. The internal is the phosphorus that is trapped on the lake bottom that has accumulated over the years and that is released when the oxygen is depleted from the bottom waters. The external nutrient loading comes from our entire

watershed through runoff. We just received 5+ inches of rain from Tropical Storm Irene and another 3 inches of rain the following week. The sudden increase in external nutrient loading from this extreme weather pattern only compounded our de-stratification that we normally experience this time of the year.

## Fall Fertilizing by M. Rokjer

Everyone lives in a watershed whether you live close to a body of water or not. A watershed is the surrounding land that drains into a lake, stream, or river. It includes drainage systems such as ditches and storm sewers, which mean you have a direct effect on water quality. As we welcome fall, many homeowners realize it is time to fertilize your lawn. The grass has endured the

summer stresses and the cool temperatures provide the perfect opportunity for recovery. The benefits of fall fertilization include a healthier turf before winter along with a healthier root system. **Before you fertilize however, think responsibly.** Phosphates are a major source of pollution in lakes and streams, and high phosphate levels support over-production of algae

and water weeds. Phosphorous comes from many sources such as leaves, lawn clippings, animal waste, and it is in most lawn fertilizers.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has some wonderful videos and publications on [Healthy Lawn Care Practices](http://www.epa.gov/pesticides/lawncare/) (<http://www.epa.gov/pesticides/lawncare/>) that you can apply to reduce the amount of runoff pollutants in your watershed.
