tournament was one of the few. It was quite unusual not to have snow on the lake this winter.



Harvesting News by Marie Rokjer

You are all aware of the unusual weather pattern that the northeast has experienced this year. We have had warmer than usual temperatures causing the ice to go out much earlier than it normally does. This, in addition to the lack of snow cover on the ice, will probably lead to the weeds getting a "head start" on the normal growing season. (The snow cover on the ice prevents the sun from filtering through to the dormant weeds.) We

had a good lake level drawdown before winter set in which helps to kill weed growth along the shorelines.

Weed harvesting will begin in open waters by the end of May. We're enclosing a harvesting request form with this newsletter. 



The CLIA board has chosen to hold the line on the cost of member participation in the harvesting program at \$125. For this you are entitled to have your shoreline harvested each time the crew circles the lake. The crew usually provides 3 cycles per season. In 2011 we were able to complete 4 cycles, but that's not the norm. The 3 cycles, plus meeting our contracts with the 2 towns, takes the full season.

Be Aware of Hogweed

You may have heard of Hogweed or possibly Wild Parsnip or Queen Anne's Lace as it is sometimes referred to. No matter what the version of plant or the name being used, you need to be aware of the plant and know that it is growing locally. The CLIA has reported on this in the past, local newspapers covered it this fall and there is information all over the internet, including postings by NYS DOT and NYS DEC.

This is a dangerous plant that is known to surround Cossayuna

Lake. If the sap on the plant gets on skin and then is exposed to sunlight, it can lead to severe burns. Simply, the plant affects the skins ability to protect itself.

The sap can also cause severe damage if it comes in contact with the eye.

As spring approaches, please keep this information in mind and monitor the foliage around your property. The safety of those in our community is our concern and we want to ensure the information is circulated.

CHARACTERISTIC OF HOGWEED

White umbrella shaped flowers

Commonly mistaken for Queen Anne's Lace

HOGWEED SAFETY

- Do not touch the plant with bare skin
- Do not touch bare skin with sap-covered gloves
- Prevent the sap from reaching skin by; wearing long waterproof gloves, long sleeves, pants, boots and eye protection
- If controlling plants with multiple people, keep a good distance from one another as the sap can splash
- Apply sunblock before beginning to work
- Launder clothes that may have contacted plants
- Wash equipment with water immediately after use
- Limit exposure to sunlight after working with plants or work around plants after sunset
- Do not use a 'weed-whacker' or brush cutter, to avoid sap splatter
- Keep water, soap and eyewash near work area in case of exposure.


