

We are fortunate to have a dedicated group of volunteers who give their time to collect water samples of the lake for analysis, manually harvest invasive water chestnuts, monitor lake water levels, work with state and local officials to improve awareness, and generally provide “boots on the ground” to help ensure the overall quality of the lake.

However, a large component of our efforts to keep non-native invasive species of weeds in check is our Lake Management herbicide treatment program. This program requires close coordination between the CLIA, DEC and a professional herbicide applicator company. There is no denying that the program is expensive; we rely on the generosity of members and non-members alike to maintain the appropriate level of funding to carry out the program each year.


Membership

2024 Herbicide Treatment Plan Update

Sheila Rappazzo, Herbicide Chair

This is the second year of our 3-year commitment with Pond and Lake Connection (PLC) as our herbicide applicator. We will again be treating some areas for Eurasian Milfoil with ProcellaCOR. We will be treating areas for Curlyleaf Pondweed with Aquathol, and we have requested authorization to also use Aquathol, later in the season if needed, to treat overgrowth of Southern Naiad.

The herbicide application was filed with the NY State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) in January, and is currently under review by various Departments within. We expect that the DEC will issue the permit by sometime in April to allow for treatment as early in the season as possible. The areas to be treated will be based on the pre-treatment assessment that PLC will conduct, ideally in late April.

Harvesting Update

Gene Henry, Harvesting Chair

After weeks of searching, Gene Henry located a “new” used truck to replace the aging vehicle which served us well, but which needed replacing. A team of Gene, Tom LeCours and Charlie Rappazzo drove to Pompano Beach to inspect and ultimately purchase the vehicle (pictured right). Information for Property Owners - Particularly for Owners Who Rent

Invasive non-native weeds negatively impact lake health and recreational use. Last year we spent roughly \$25,000 on treatment of the lake to control those weeds and expect to spend the same on that effort this year, as it is an ongoing effort to keep the lake healthy. In order to minimize the impact of invasive weeds and keep our lake as healthy as possible we need **everyone's** cooperation.

All boats should be clean and checked for weeds before being put in the lake. To prevent shoreline erosion, keep speeds very low when leaving, or approaching a dock or going along the shore. Legal limit is 5 miles an hour within 100 feet of shore.


No Wake Boats, **please!** They create tremendous erosion in our shallow lake. For more information:

All individuals born on or after 5/1/96 are required to successfully complete an approved course in Boater's Safety to operate a motor boat or personal watercraft. A Boater Safety course will be offered at CLIA on June 1st. It can also be taken online. More details are on the CLIA website.

Keep speeds at reasonable levels in consideration of other boaters around you, and to not create excessive wakes, which can damage shorelines. Be aware of other boats and water craft around you. The lake can get very crowded on weekends and holidays in particular.

Cold Weather Boaters

Per NYS Nav. Law Section 40.1(e)

Anyone underway in a boat less than 21 feet in length between November 1 and May 1 must wear a securely fastened life jacket. This includes canoes, kayaks, rowboats and motorboats.

Commercial vessels are exempt.

Bob Reilly has gathered information and pictures of the lake area dating back to 1916 in a binder that he will leave at the clubhouse. Anyone who is interested can look at it. It contains the history of the lake and Argyle, pictures and history of "The Oaks" and pictures of Kincaid's, Lashers and Little Troy Road.



Public Education Course Flyer: About Boating Safely



If you are interested in an exciting, in-depth boating safety course, check out the in classroom (seminar) version of our popular online boating course.

This beginner boating class will give you the knowledge needed to obtain a boat license or safety certification in many states. Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete *About Boating Safely*.

TOPICS INCLUDE:

Introduction to Boating - Types of power boats; sailboats; outboards; paddle boats; houseboats; different uses of boats; various power boating engines; jet drives; family boating basics.

Boating Law - Boat registration; boating regulation; hull identification number; required boat safety equipment; operating safely and reporting accidents; protecting the marine environment; Federal boat law; state boating laws; personal watercraft requirements.

Boat Safety Equipment - Personal flotation devices ("life jackets"); fire extinguishers; sound-producing devices; visual-distress signals; dock lines and rope; first aid kit; anchors and anchor lines; other boating safety equipment. About Boating Safely

Safe Boating - Bow riding; alcohol and drug abuse; entering, loading, and trimming a boat; fueling portable and permanent tanks; steering with a tiller and a wheel; docking, undocking and mooring; knots; filing a float plan; checking equipment, fuel, weather and tides; using charts; choosing and using an anchor; safe PWC handling; general water safety.

Navigation - The U.S. Aids to Navigation system; types of buoys and beacons; navigation rules (sometimes referred to as right-of-way rules); avoiding collisions; sound signals; PWC "tunnel vision."

Boating Problems - Hypothermia; boating accidents and rescues; man overboard recovery; capsizing; running aground; river hazards; strainers; emergency radio calls; engine problems; equipment failures; carbon monoxide (CO); other boating and PWC problems.

Trailering, Storing and Protecting Your Boat - Types of trailers; trailer brakes, lights, hitches, tires, and bearings; loading, balancing, and towing a trailer; towing (and backing) a trailer; boat launching and retrieving; boat storage and theft protection; launching, retrieving and storing a PWC.

Hunting and Fishing, Water-skiing and River Boating - Carrying hunting gear and weapons in a boat; fishing from a boat; water-skiing safety guidelines and hand signals; water-skiing with a PWC; navigating rivers, and other boating tips.




