Lake Management Update

Sheila Rappazzo, Lake Management Taskforce Chair

Last year was the final year of a 3-year contract with Pond and Lake Connection. They used the relatively new herbicide ProcellaCor, which was supposed to have a very good long-term effect on Eurasian Milfoil, supposedly controlling it for three years. But it didn't work quite like that on our lake. While the first two years were good, this last year, the 3rd year of the contract, by early summer there were significant large beds of milfoil. Fragments from these large weed beds has resulted in the spread of milfoil to many areas throughout the lake.

So this next year we are anticipating a large treatment area to knock it back again. We believe we need to treat 120 acres in order to accomplish that. It was been over ten years since that much acreage has needed to be treated. One hundred twenty (120) acres were treated in 2013 and 2014 and that made a significant difference in controlling the invasive weeds. The cost of herbicides, similar to almost everything else, has risen significantly in the last 10 plus years. So this large treatment is going to be expensive, but necessary.

In addition to the milfoil issue, we have found that the naiad weed species that has become so problematic is invasive Brittle Naiad, not Southern Naiad that has traditionally been in our Lake. Other lakes in the region, including Saratoga Lake and Glen Lake have also had significant problems with overgrowth of this weed. We are pursuing this issue with the DEC. Currently the DEC in Region 5 (our region) does not allow treatment after June 15th, and that is too early to allow effective treatment of the Naiads.

We hope you will be supportive of these efforts as we treat the lake as a whole body. Please be generous when you decide to donate.

Ice Safety

As a friendly reminder, most bodies of water such as Cossayuna Lake don't freeze over evenly. The general rule for safely walking on ice is a minimum thickness of 3-4 inches on solid clear ice. Always be cognizant of what's ahead of you. A minimum of 5 inches of ice is recommended for snowmobiling or driving on ice with an ATV. If you are driving a car or small pickup, you'll need ice 8-12 inches thick. Medium-sized trucks require 12-15 inches of ice. Be cautious of "bubblers" which are generally used to protect docks from ice buildup. Areas near the shoreline where streams enter and exit the lake likely will also affect the integrity of the ice.

It's a best practice not to ice fish alone. The buddy system can save lives. If you must go out alone, let someone know where you are going and expected back. And be sure to dress appropriately. The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) highly recommends carrying ice safety picks in case of an emergency should you break through the ice.

This will require some patience; the grant process may take as long as 2 years to complete. In the meantime, we hope all lake residents will continue to contribute to the herbicide fund.

Our existing harvester is already set to go to work next season. Please bring your questions regarding Harvesting to the Membership Meeting so we can discuss and address your concerns. It's a big lake and we try our best to improve the quality of the water.

In addition to trying to secure a grant for a new harvester, we are also looking at a company that uses dredging to remove weeds and hope to have a demonstration in the spring. The lake may be frozen but we are still working to make it better for the coming season. Thanks for everyone's cooperation and support.




